Annual Report for FY2021



### A Message from the Executive Director

FY2021 has been another challenging year working to provide the most library services and resources during the continued COVID-19 pandemic. The Library lost seven employees during the year, ending the year with 15.5 FTE employees. The three branches were briefly re-opened in October 2020 for limited library services, but closed down in late November due to rising COVID-19 cases. Throughout this time contactless services continued, including curbside pick-up of materials, virtual programs and faxing and copies services. Thanks to Caroline County Administrator Jeremy Goldman, library staff benefited from being included with teachers for vaccines. The three library branches reopened March 15, 2021, a full year from the initial closing. On demand curb-side service continues, as does Books-By-Mail services.

When vaccinations became available in Caroline County, Library staff created a Call Center for the Caroline County Health Department, taking calls to answer questions and help get people registered for vaccines. When it became apparent that the Call Center would continue indefinitely, the County hired staff to take over the work, freeing Library staff to get back to their jobs.

The Library continues to manage Dolly Parton's Imagination Library in Caroline County. The staff of the Caroline County Public Schools remain to be the largest fundraisers for this program.

The Library received notice that it would receive a FY2022 Maryland State Library capital grant to complete the design plan for renovation of the first floor of the Central Library based on the 2019 Library Space Utilization Feasibility Study. A FY2023 Maryland State Library capital grant application was submitted for the construction of the Central Library first floor renovation. The Board of Library Trustees will be providing the local match with money from their John Hargreaves fund. The Friends of the Library were asked to assist the Board with funding the cost of new furniture, fixtures, and equipment as part of the FY2023 renovation not covered by the capital grant. Our continued thanks to our Board of Library Trustees and Friends of the Library for their support. Special thanks to Terenda Thomas and Amy Brandt, who completed their terms on the Board; and a warm welcome to Sarah Dahl and Kaleb Hignutt, who's first term begins July 1, 2021.

We look forward to rebuilding our library team in FY2022 and expanding our number of services, hours and resources to the community, all the while keeping Equity, Diversity and Inclusion in the forefront.

# COVID closures can't stop us!

The Library operated contactless from July 1, 2020 – March 15, 2021 with brief reopening of the facilities in October 2020. We returned to contactless services in November 2020, when COVID-19 cases started escalating.




# CCPL CARRIES ON ITS MISSION VIRTUALLY AND IN PERSON


Makerspace to the rescue!

teachers were very grateful.


